## Living Wage for Workers

Making Hamilton a Living Wage community would mean that the City, public institutions, and private employers would provide a living wage: a level of pay that would enable someone working full-time to earn enough to meet their basic needs, including food, shelter, clothing, child care, medical needs and transportation.

- 25,000 Hamiltonians work full or part time and don't earn enough to move out of poverty. If you believe this is unacceptable, come and help determine a community response!
